## LAFLA Legal Services

### Eviction Defense

- Provide free direct representation for those facing wrongful eviction
- Defend public housing residents and Section 8 voucher holders from losing housing/subsidy
- Help clients living in uninhabitable conditions get repairs, reductions in rent
- Preserve Rent Stabilized Ordinance (RSO) tenancies and prevent RSO violations

### Housing & Homelessness

- Prevent unfair displacement; preserve and expand affordable housing
- Defend rights of unhoused individuals and families
- Provide legal services to households facing homelessness and/or imminent eviction in LA County

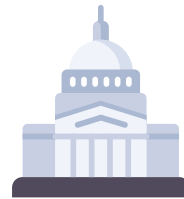
## Domestic Violence/Family Law

- Assist and represent survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault in obtaining restraining orders, and orders for custody, dissolution, visitation, and support



## Immigration

- Assist and represent undocumented survivors of domestic violence, torture, human trafficking, and other serious abuse in removal proceedings and before USCIS
- Assist and represent individuals before USCIS to become U.S. Citizens (*Note: You may be eligible for assistance from LAFLA in securing your immigration status if you have been a victim of domestic violence, sexual assault, child abuse, human trafficking, torture, and other serious crimes regardless of where it occurred.*)



## Government Benefits

- Help people obtain benefits to fulfill basic needs (food, shelter, medical care, and services to attain self-sufficiency)

## Employment

- Fight wage theft, denial of unemployment insurance benefits
- Advise on wrongful terminations and discriminatory employment practices

## Expungement

- Clear past criminal convictions so people can have access to better work and housing opportunities



## Student Loan Issues

- Assist people who cannot afford to repay their student loans due to disability or who have attended for-profit colleges that engaged in predatory, deceptive, or illegal practices

## Veterans

### Justice Center

- Advocate on behalf of Veterans to obtain life-sustaining income, health, and housing benefits
- Dismiss tickets and expunge convictions so Veterans can have a fresh start
- Upgrade unjust less-than-honorable military discharges
- Prevent Veteran homelessness



### Medical-Legal Partnerships

- Provide patients with access to legal services (only available through health care providers that partner with LAFLA)

### Torture Survivors Project

- Provide legal assistance, representation, and community education to immigrants who are victims of torture

### Asian & Pacific Islander (API) Community Outreach Project

- Provide linguistically accessible, culturally intelligent, trauma-informed help to API clients in their preferred language, with access to all LAFLA services

### Nonprofit Assistance

- Provide legal support to community-based organizations seeking to build healthy, economically vibrant communities
