

SERVICE OF SMALL CLAIMS DOCUMENTS VIA THE LA COUNTY SHERIFF

If you are suing a person or entity located in Los Angeles County, the Sheriff can serve small claims documents such as the small claims complaint (SC-100) on the defendant for you. This guide outlines the steps you must take to use Los Angeles County Sheriff to serve small claims court documents:

Angeles County Sheriff to serve small claims court documents:	
Locate the correct Sheriff's Office location	If the person you are suing (the defendant) is located within Los Angeles County, the Sheriff's office located nearest to the person you are suing can assist • Find the correct office by entering the <u>defendant's address</u> in the locator tool: http://civil.lasd.org/CivilProcess/Searchaddr2.aspx?FrmType=16&status=0 If the Defendant lives in another county you must contact that county's Sheriff Civil Process Unit to determine what their process is to serve court papers.
Complete the Sheriff's Instructions Form	 Fill out Sheriff's Instructions Form (available here) Make sure to have a correct and valid address for person(s) you are suing. Enter any additional instructions/information in the space provided. Review a sample form here.
Drop off your request	Drop off the documents with the correct Sheriff's office at least <u>FOUR WEEKS (ONE MONTH)</u> before your hearing date. Drop off in person or mail the following documents to the Sheriff's Office location: • 1 copy of the <u>Sheriff's Instructions Form</u> • 2 copies of each document that will be served (SC-100 and SC-100A and/or MC-031, if applicable). Be sure that you provide copies of the filed versions that are stamped by the court clerk with your case number.
Fees for services	 If you have a fee waiver (FW-001), this service is at no cost to you. Bring a copy of your approved fee waiver when you drop off the documents at the Sheriff's Office. If you do not have a fee waiver: You will be charged after the Sheriff attempts service If service is successful, you will be charged a \$40 fee per defendant If the person is not found after three attempts the sheriff's office will charge \$35 for "not found." The amount can be paid by check, money order, or cash.
Complete Service of Process	The Sheriff will make up to three attempts to complete personal or substituted service based on the address and additional instructions you provide in the Sheriff's Instructions Form. If the defendant is served → sheriff will file proof of service with the court and a copy will be mailed to you. If the defendant is not served → the sheriff will send you a "Certificate of not found/No Service" describing their attempts at service and the reasons they could not serve the documents on the defendant(s). • You can request the sheriff's office to re-attempt service at a new address or the same address. You will be charged for the service again.
